# HOW TO GET STARTED WATCHING AN IIWP USTREAM BROADCAST

For those that are new to computers, and those that are already computer savvy, here are some suggestions for you to get the best experience out of viewing Ustream broadcasts.

## 1. SPEED TEST

A speed test is something that will help you identify how much bandwidth you have available to you to view a show. It takes several minutes to run the test. The most important speed to know is your upload speed. If it is **.90mbps** or higher you should have no problem viewing the online broadcasts. Please type into your web browser, <http://www.speedtest.net> . Once the page loads, click on "BEGIN TEST" and wait a few minutes while it runs the test. It will give you an upload and download speed.

**If your upload speed is not .90mbps** or higher, then you can discuss this with your Internet Service Provider and find out how to upgrade.

## 2. WEB BROWSER

Your web browser is an important component to viewing the Ustream broadcast. We recommend "Google Chrome." If you do not have it, just go into whatever browser you currently have (i.e. Firefox, Internet Explorer, etc.) and type in "google chrome" then click where it says to download and install Google Chrome onto your computer. It takes about 10 minutes. Google has Adobe Flash Player built into it and keeps it automatically updated (Adobe Flash Player is what allows you to view Ustream broadcasts).

## 3. JAVA

The second thing to check that you have the most current version of is called "Java." Again, just type the word "java" into your browser and click on the link that says "download and install java." Let it run the installation, if you have the most current version it will give you a message indicating this, if you do not, then follow the instructions.

## 4. MESSAGES SHOWING UP IN GOOGLE CHROME AND WHAT TO DO WITH THEM

Anytime you see the following messages in Google Chrome follow these steps.

### Java plug-in needs permission



If you see a message bar within Chrome that says **The Java plug-in needs your permission to run**, you can perform one of the following actions:

- Click the **Run this time button** to allow the Java content on the page to run only until you leave this page.
- Click **Always run on this site** to allow Java to run on all this site's pages. You will not see this message again for pages on this site.

If you are downloading Java within Chrome and this message is shown, we recommend clicking the **Always run on this site** button.

### Additional plug-in required

If you see a message bar within Chrome that says **an additional plug-in is required to display some elements on this page**, click on the **Install plug-in** link in the Chrome message bar, or download from [java.com](http://java.com).

### Plug-in out of date

If you see a message bar within Chrome that says **Plug-in out of date**, click on the **Update plug-in** link in the Chrome message bar to get the latest Java.

## 5. HOW OLD IS YOUR COMPUTER?

If your computer is over 4 years old, an upgrade is probably needed. The processors to run video streams are not as powerful on computers older than 4 years. Nowadays, many desktops are reasonably priced.

## **6. FOR IPAD USERS AND ALL OTHER DEVICES**

Please note that the Ustream app only works with PUBLIC broadcasts. If we are running a PASSWORD PROTECTED EVENT, then you would type the specific link we give you directly into the browser.

### **HERE ARE THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR IPAD USERS FOR PASSWORD PROTECTED EVENTS:**

Download the app, **iSwifter**, which is normally used for games.

Then, type in the URL (you can't copy-and-paste), and then go thru the normal, 2 log in processes.

Access may be slow, depending on how many others are using it for games at the time.

Downloading the app and getting in takes approximately 10 minutes.

### **A COUPLE NOTES**

If you are using 3G on your iPad, please switch it to wifi. Also make sure that you can open Safari on your iPad and can surf the web. Lastly try to restart the iPad.

If you have an iPod cable, you can hook your iPad up to your TV monitor for your viewing pleasure, or same thing with the iPod touch.
